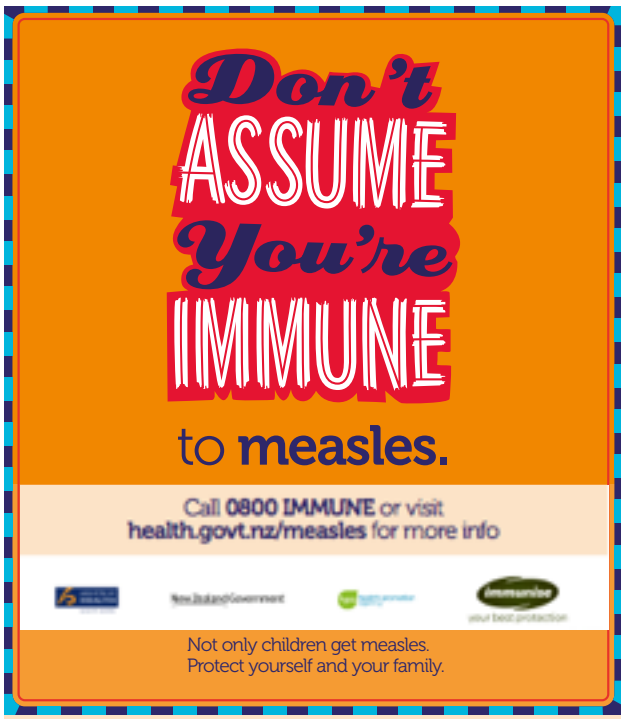
NATHAN MAKAERE-WALLIS

MEASLES UPDATE

There have been confirmed cases of measles in the Manawatu and Horowhenua. It is a good time to check your Plunket records to ensure your child has been immunised. It's also a good time to remind parents of the symptoms to look out for:

- general red rash starting on the head and neck and then moving to the trunk and arms
- can start behind the ears
- it is a red blotchy rash
- fever &/or cough
- runny nose, sticky eyes
- white spots inside the mouth and cheeks.

Should you suspect your child has any of these symptoms **DO NOT SEND THEM TO SCHOOL.** Contact your GP or Health Line on 0800 611 116 as measles is a highly infectious disease.
